Annual Vestry & Parochial Church Meetings: Lavenham – Wednesday 24 April 7pm. At the Annual Vestry Meeting two Churchwardens are elected for a term of one year. As the office of churchwarden is a public office held on behalf of the whole community, the vestry meeting is open to all residents of the village. Those entitled to vote for churchwardens include anyone on the electoral roll of the parish church and anyone who lives in the village whose name is on the register of local government electors. The second part of the meeting is the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), when we consider the annual accounts and activities of the church, and give thanks for all that we have shared together. It is also a meeting at which elections take place for membership of the Parochial Church Council (PCC). If you are interested in standing as Churchwarden or in joining the PCC will find nomination forms at the back of church in Lavenham, or speak to the churchwardens. To vote at the APCM you need to be on the Church Electoral Roll – please speak to the Churchwardens if you are not, but would like to be.

Changes to the Service Pattern: Please see the back page for details of the new pattern.


#### **Choir and Music Group:**

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. A reading from the first letter of John.

And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

## Gospel Reading - Mark 1.4-11

A reading from the Gospel according to Mark.

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.' In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'
